
Defining Resilience

USAID defines resilience as "the ability of people, households, communities, countries and systems to mitigate, adapt to and recover from shocks and stresses in a manner that reduces chronic vulnerability and facilitates inclusive growth"

- USAID's Building Resilience to Recurrent Crisis (2012)


Shocks and stresses

(covariate and idiosyncratic)




Resilience Capacities

(resources, assets and strategies)





Sources of Resilience: Livelihoods


Resilient Livelihoods for managing and diversifying risk and maintaining consumption, including through *access to financial services*






Sources of Resilience: Institutions and Systems

 Resilient systems – for managing resources and risks that are beyond or overwhelm the capacity of HH and communities to manage on their own








Sources of Resilience: Human Capital

Bangladesh 2014 flood: food security by flood exposure and women's empowerment









Ethiopia: Resilience in the Face of the 2016 Drought

Change in Food Security by Drought Severity/Program Exposure






Drought Severity and Humanitarian Need in Kenya's ASALs





Poverty Reduction in the Face of Recurrent Droughts in Kenya's Northern Arid Lands


Poverty Prevalence (< \$1.25 pp/day)

Defining Self-Reliance

the ability of a country, including the government, civil society, and the private sector, to plan, finance, and implement solutions to solve its own development challenges.

<u>Commitment</u> - How well a country's laws, policies, actions, and informal governance mechanisms, such as cultures and norms, support progress toward self-reliance.

<u>Capacity</u> - How far a country has come in its journey across the dimensions of political, social, and economic development, including ability to work across these sectors.
